

SHERIFF'S SALE.

County of Albert.

There will be sold at Public Auction in front of the Court House in the Parish of Hopewell, in the County of Albert, in the Province of New Brunswick, on THURSDAY the eleventh day of SEPTEMBER, A. D. 1902, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon:

ALL the right, title, interest, property, claim and demand, either in law or in equity, of The Mineral Products Company of, into or out of all the lots, pieces or parcels of lands situate, lying and being in the said County of Albert, and which are bounded and described as follows:

1st. All that certain piece or parcel of land situate and being in the Parish of Hillsborough, in the said County, and bounded on the north by the Great Road, on the east by lands now or formerly owned and occupied by William P. Duffy, on the south by lands now or late of Stephen Steeves, and on the west by land now or late of Stephen Steeves. The said lot of land being known as the Patrick Duffy lot, and containing one hundred and fifty acres of land more or less, and being the premises heretofore conveyed by Bliss Steeves and wife to the Cremora Manganese Company, and which said premises were thereafter conveyed by the Cremora Manganese Company to Frederic Clark Sayles.

2nd. 4th.
