PERMITS TO ENTER THE TRANSVAAL OR ORANGE RIVER COLONY.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That henceforth permits to enter the Transvaal or Orange River Colony will be issued only at South African Ports. Persons wishing to proceed to those Colonies should therefore apply for permits to the Permit Office at the Port at which they propose to land. Such Permits may be refused, and in order to avoid disappointment and delay it is suggested that persons about to proceed thither should ascertain before sailing for South Africa from the Permit Office at the Port of Landing whether permits will be granted to them. Under the of Landing whether permits will be granted to them. Under the Peace Preservation Order now in force in the Transvaal and Orange River Colony, persons entering those Colonies without permits may be ordered to leave, and if such order is net obeyed within a certain time, they are liable to fine and imprisonment.
