His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve and confirm the following Regulations, adopted by the Provincial Board of Health on the 19th day December, 1901:—

REGULATIONS.

REGULATION No. 1. From and after the date hereof and until this Regulation is repealed, a medical officer or officers, who shall be appointed by the Board, with the approval of the Provincial Secretary, or by any lawful authority, may attend and examine passengers arriving at or departing from the City of Saint John by steamboats or vessels, and examine and inspect all such steamboats and vessels, and such officer or officers may detain any of the passengers or employees travelling or being thereon, or about to travel thereon, who may not be vaccinated or who fail to produce a certificate of vaccination or give such proof of having been recently vaccinated as may be required by such medical officer or officers, and may authorize the detention of any such steamboat or vessel and may prevent the entry or departure of any such steamboat or vessel to or from the said City of Saint John, except in accordance with such sanitary conditions and regulations as may for the time being be in force in the Province, and may authorize and require the detention of or removal from such steamboats or other vessels of all persons infected by smallpox or liable to communicate the same to others, and of any cargoes, freight or baggage coming from or suspected to be coming from any district infected with such disease.

REGULATION No. 2. From and after the date hereof and until this Regulation is repealed, it shall and may be lawful for any health officer or officers appointed by the Board, with the approval of the Provincial Secretary and it shall be the duty of any such officer or officers, to attend at the place for which such officer or officers are appointed and examine

passengers landing in or departing from any of the following railway stations, namely:—Saint John, McAdam Junction, Fredericton Junction, Edmundston and Campbellton in the Province of New Brunswick, by railway trains, and to examine and inspect all railway trains arriving at or departing from each of the said stations; and such officer or officers may detain any of the passengers or employees travelling or being on any of such railway trains or about to travel thereon, who may not be vaccinated or who fail to produce a certificate of vaccination or give such proof of having been recently vaccinated as may be required by such medical officer or officers; and may authorize the detention of any locomotive or cars for the examination or fumigation thereof, and may prevent the entry or departure of such locomotive, cars, passengers, baggage cars and freights to or from any of said stations, except in accordance with such sanitary conditions and regulations as may for the time being be in force in the Province, and may authorize the detention of or removal from such railway trains of all persons infected with smallpox or liable to communicate the same to others, and of any freight or baggage coming from or suspected to be coming from any district infected with such disease.
