

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the objects hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "BAY OF FUNDY OIL COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) The proposed corporate name of the Company is, "THE J. W. DUMAS COMPANY, Limited."

(b) The objects and purposes for which the incorporation of the said Company is sought are:

To buy and otherwise acquire, take over and hold the business of Joseph W. Dumas as now carried on by the said Joseph W. Dumas in the County of Gloucester, under the name and style of Joseph W. Dumas, with any and all of his real estate, lands and premises, leases, book debts, stock in trade, personal property, effects, debts, stock in trade, manu-
