NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the Board of License Commissioners for the License District of Restigouche County, under "The Liquor License Act, 1896," will meet in the Court House in the Town of Dalhousie, on THURSDAY the 24th day of APRIL, A. D. 1902, at ten o'clock, a. m., for the purpose of considering applications to sell liquor under the provisions of the said Act, as well as all matters relating thereto, for the ensuing license year, commencing the first day of May next.

The total number of licenses in this district at present is six, all retail: and three of the licensees, namely: Thomas Murphy, Michael P. Doyle, and Felix Ultican, have petitioned for a renewal of their licenses for their respective hotel premises for another year. The other three licensees, namely: George E. Mercier, John M. McLeod, and John C. Barclay, have retired from the business. The last named has leased his hotel premises at Jacquet River to John Barbour, who now occupies the premises and who has petitioned for a renewal of the license for the same premises for another year in the place of the said John C.
