NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is the "F. A. JONES COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are as follows:—

To purchase, acquire, and take over the furniture business carried on by Frederic A. Jones at the City of Saint John, together with all the goods, chattels, assets, property and effects owned by him in connection with said business, or so much and such part thereof, and upon such terms, as may be agreed on with the said Frederic A. Jones. And to carry on and conduct at the City of Saint, or elsewhere, the business of manufacturing, fashioning, making, buying, selling and dealing in all kinds of household, office and all other kinds of furniture, furnishings and supplies, and generally to deal in, buy and sell all kinds of furniture, furnishings, supplies and other materials usually dealt in in connection with a furniture and furniture manufacturing and supply business and to act as agents for others in connection therewith and generally to perform, conduct and carry on all business of every kind in connection with the purchase, manufacture and sale of all kinds of furniture, furnishings and supplies and all business incidental thereto and both on commission and otherwise.

And also to carry on a general manufacturing, trading and mercantile business with respect to such articles of merchandise as to the said Company shall be deemed expedient.

And also to purchase, lease, acquire and to have and hold real and personal estate of all kinds, including bonds and stocks of any incorporated Company, and to take, acquire, have and hold security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever.

And also to purchase and acquire the stock in trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses, effects and assets of any person or persons, or any incorporated Company now or hereafter carrying on any manufacturing or mercantile business, and to take security thereon, and to continue the same when so acquired or to sell and dispose of the same when so acquired and every part thereof whenever to the said Company it shall be deemed expedient so to do.

And also to purchase, acquire, lease, have and hold real and personal property of all kinds, and to sell and dispose of and convey said property, real and personal, or any part thereof.

And also to sell and convey, alienate, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise to dispose of, deal with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the said Company upon any terms whatsoever, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, together with all such powers, rights, privileges and franchises which are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the said proposed Company in any or all of its branches, with such other powers and things as are incidental thereto.

And also to do any and all the things in these Letters Patent set forth as objects, purposes and powers of said Company, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do whether in the said City of Saint John, or elsewhere, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise.

3. The office or chief place of business of the said Company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the said Company is to be Forty thousand dollars, divided into four hundred shares of One hundred dollars each, of which Twenty thousand dollars shall be (a) Stock or Ordinary Stock of the Company, and the remaining Twenty thousand dollars shall be (b) Stock or Preference Stock of the said Company.
