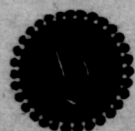

New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in
amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the
applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become share-
holders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic,
under the name and for all the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE
MAJESTIC STEAMSHIP COMPANY."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought
are as follows:

And also for the building, repairing, maintaining and operat-
ing all wharves, piers, docks, dry docks, buildings, warehouses,
repairing and designing houses, machines, and other equipments;
and to build, construct, repair, maintain and operate any and all
wharves, piers and like works of private or public use or utility;
and to own, operate and maintain steamship lines, sailing vessels,
scows, tugboats and other vessels, or lines of vessels, also for the
transportation of goods, merchandise and passengers upon land
or water, and all business of every kind in connection with or
incidental to any of the purposes aforesaid or to the business of
common carriers in general.

And also to purchase, acquire, lease, have and hold real and per-
sonal property of all kinds, and to sell, mortgage, pledge, dispose
of and convey such real or personal property, or any part thereof.

And also to purchase or acquire in any other way any bonds
and stocks of any other incorporated Company, and to take,
