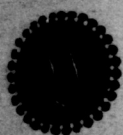

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purpose hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "O. H. WARWICK COMPANY."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To acquire, purchase, take over, carry on and continue the crockery business at present carried on by O. H. Warwick, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, together with the stock, stock-in-trade, goods, chattels, merchandise, property, assets and effects belonging thereto, and also the good-will of the said business, and all rights and credits, choses in action, securities for the payment of money, judgments, liens, book debts, debits and credits, accounts and liabilities thereto belonging or appertaining or connected therewith, and upon such terms as may be agreed upon for the acquiring of the said business and property; and also to conduct and carry on a general crockery business, and the business of buying and selling and dealing in all kinds of china, earthenware, glassware, silverware, lamps and lighting goods, cutlery, jewellery, pictures, fancy goods, and such other goods, wares and merchandise as are dealt in in connection with the said business; also to act as agents in the buying or selling of goods, wares and merchandise or other properties, and to buy and sell on commission.

(b) To purchase, acquire, and carry on a pottery or potteries and other manufactories, together with the necessary plant or equipment for the manufacture of all or any of the wares in connection with the said crockery business, or such other business as the Company may engage in, with all the powers necessary or incident to carry on the said pottery business or manufacturing business.

(c) Also to purchase and acquire the stock, stock-in-trade, real and personal property, franchises, rights, patents, patent rights, licenses, assets and rights, shares, bonds or securities, of any person or persons, or any corporate Company, and to sell and dispose of the same with all the necessary powers incident

thereto; and to acquire, purchase and hold an interest and interests in any pottery or potteries or manufactory, and dispose of the same.

(d) Also to purchase, acquire, hold, lease, sell, convey and dispose of, and mortgage, pledge, or otherwise encumber, real estate and any interest in real estate or personal property or any interest therein.

(e) Also to conduct and carry on a general mercantile and merchandise business and the business of buying and selling goods, wares and merchandise.

(f) Also to do and perform all acts and things and to have all the powers and privileges connected with the said Company for the performing of the objects and purposes of the Company as set forth in this notice to the same extent and as fully and effectually as any person or persons in his or their individual capacity might do as principles, agents or otherwise.

3. The chief or principal place of business of the said Company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The proposed Capital Stock of the said Company is Sixty thousand dollars to be divided into six hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.
