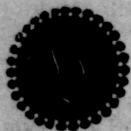

WHEREAS having been con-  
strained on account of Our ill-  
ness to postpone the day originally  
named for Our Coronation We now by the favour and blessing  
of Almighty God propose that the ceremony shall take place on  
Saturday, the 9th day of the present month of August;

And Whereas We are desirous that the said day should be  
observed as a day of general thanksgiving and rejoicing through-  
out Canada,—

Now, therefore, Know Ye, that We have thought fit, by and  
with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint and  
set apart Saturday the 9th day of August instant as a public  
holiday to be observed as a day of public thanksgiving and re-  
joicing by all persons throughout Our Dominion of Canada.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these  
presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to  
govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to  
be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto  
affixed. WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-Beloved  
Cousin and Councillor the Right Honourable Sir GILBERT JOHN  
ELLIOT, Earl of Minto and Viscount Melgund of Melgund,  
County of Forfar, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom,  
Baron Minto of Minto, County of Roxburgh, in the Peerage  
of Great Britain, Baronet of Nova Scotia, Knight Grand Cross  
of Our Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George,  
etc., etc., Governor General of Canada.

FIRST day of AUGUST, in the year of Our Lord one thousand  
nine hundred and two, and in the second year of Our Reign.

### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New  
Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts,  
Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Pro-  
vince of New Brunswick, bearing date the thirtieth day of July,  
A. D. 1902, incorporating Carey A. Fawcett, of Memramcook, Bee-  
Keeper; Joshua Peters, of Moncton, Manufacturer; Clifford W.  
Robinson, of Moncton, Barrister; John C. Patterson, of Moncton,  
Mechanic; A. E. Peters, of Moncton, Manufacturer; H. R. Peters,  
of Moncton, Student; R. Clark, of Moncton, Banker; A. H. Jones,  
of Moncton, Broker; James T. Ryan, of Moncton, Merchant; and  
James P. Sherry, of Memramcook, Merchant; all in the County  
of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the fol-  
lowing purposes, namely:—

To buy, sell and deal in Bees, Bee-Hives, Apiaries, Seeds of  
Honey-plants and Bee Keepers' Supplies and appliances of every  
nature and description.

To purchase, acquire, lease, have and hold real and personal  
property of all kinds, easements, franchises, honey-rights, privi-  
leges or permits and patents of invention which the Company  
may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its busi-  
ness, and to sell, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of and  
convey the same or any part thereof.

To carry on and conduct a general Bee-keeping and honey  
producing business, including the establishing and maintenance  
of Apiaries, the buying, selling, dealing in, keeping, caring for,  
managing and breeding of Bees, the manufacturing, buying, pre-  
paring for sale, selling and dealing in Bee-Keeper's supplies and  
appliances, the extracting, storing, packing, transporting, buying,  
preparing for sale, selling and dealing in honey and wax and  
honey and wax products of every nature and description.

To erect and maintain, use, occupy and equip a building or  
buildings for the purpose of extracting, preparing and storing  
honey and the products of honey, the manufacture of honey and  
wax products or other products incidental to or arising out of the  
business of Bee-keeping and producing honey; the housing of  
Bees when required, and for any and all other purposes incidental  
to the business of the Company, and to sell, lease, mortgage, or  
otherwise dispose of the same or any part thereof.

To purchase, take over and adopt the business and all or any  
of the assets and liabilities of any person or persons, firms or cor-  
porations carrying on any business similar to the business for  
which this Company is seeking incorporation, with power to sell,  
mortgage or otherwise dispose of the same, with all such other  
things as are incident to any of the purposes herein set forth.

To enter into any agreement or agreements for sharing profits,  
union of interest or co-operation with any person or company
