

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts. Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the fourth day of March, A. D. 1902, incorporating Robert S.
