NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twelfth day of March, A. D. 1902, incorporating John Palmer, Manufacturer; James S. Neill, Merchant; Albert J. Gregory, Barrister; Edward Moore, Gentleman; E. S. Ranney Murray, Farmer; Robert W. McLellan, Barrister; William G. Clark, Merchant; Alfonso B. Kitchen, Merchant; John Kilburn, Lumberman; Alfred B. Atherton, Doctor of Medicine; W. Turney Whitehead, Land Agent; Robert F. Randolph, Merchant; E. Byron Winslow, Barrister; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; T. Sherman Peters, of Gagetown, in the County of Queen's, Province aforesaid, Farmer; George Armstrong, of Lower Saint Mary's, in the County of York, Province aforesaid, Farmer; Frederick A. The manufacturing of or contracting for the manufacture of Combination Hay, Grain and Stock Racks, Waggonboxes, Wheelbarrows, Vehicles, Farming Implements and other Implements and articles suitable for the use of farmers in the prosecution of their business, and the selling, leasing or otherwise disposing of such combination racks, waggonboxes, wheelbarrows, vehicles, farming implements and other implements aforesaid for profit or reward.

The purchasing, acquiring, leasing, owning, selling, mortgaging and conveying any and all lands, buildings and premises necessary or convenient for the purpose of carrying on the Company's business.

The building, purchasing and establishing suitable and proper factory or factories for the manufacture of such combination racks, waggonboxes, wheelbarrows, vehicles, farming implements and other implements and articles as may be dealt in by the Company, and the stocking, equipping and supplying the same with suitable plant, machinery, tools and implements.

The buying or otherwise acquiring lumber, stock, materials and commodities to be used in manufacture or in connection with the business carried on by the Company; by the name of "MARITIME COMBINATION RACK COMPANY, (Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of Twenty-five thousands dollars, divided into five hundred shares of Fifty dollars each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly 56th Victoria Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the said proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The name of the Company is to be the "SPRINGFIELD STEAMSHIP COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase or otherwise acquire the Steamer "Springfield," registered at the Port of Saint John, with all requisite equipment for the same, and to equip, own, control, sail, charter, let, hire and manage the said Steamer, and such other steamer and steamers, if any, as may be hereafter purchased, built, owned, leased or otherwise acquired or controlled by said Company for the conveyance of passengers, mails and freight upon the waters of the River Saint John and its tributaries, and other waters within the Province of New Brunswick.

(b) Also to build, purchase, charter or otherwise acquire steamers, vessels and other conveyances using steam or other motive power, and to equip, own, hold, control, manage, charter, let and hire the same for the conveyance of passengers, mails and freight, and for other purposes.

(c) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments, and construct, build, purchase, take on, lease or otherwise acquire wharves, piers, docks, buildings or other property or works, and such concessions, licenses and rights in respect of any of the same capable of being advantageously used in connection with the business of the Company.

(d) To carry, convey or transport passengers, mails and freight of all kinds, and to do the work of common carriers by steamers, vessels and other conveyances, and in connection therewith to provide, furnish and sell food, refreshments and entertainment on water and land.

(e) To mortgage, hypothecate, sell or in any way dispose of all or any of the Company's property, interests or possessions as may be deemed desirable by the Company.

(f) To hold, purchase or otherwise acquire, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock and bonds and debentures or other evidences of indebtedness created by any other corporation or corporations, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership including the right to vote thereon.

(g) To do any or all of the things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers, or otherwise, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, or otherwise.

(h) To do all and every thing incident, usual, necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation either as holder of or interested in any property or otherwise; with all the powers now or hereafter conferred by the laws of the said Province upon corporations under the said Act and the Acts in amendment thereof.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be at Springfield, in the Parish of Springfield, in the County of King's, in the said Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company is to be Twelve thousand dollars, divided into one hundred and twenty shares of One hundred dollars each.
