Whereas by an act made and passed in the Second year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An act to provide for the adoption of Atlantic Standard Time within the Province," it was, amongst other things, enacted that the said act should not go into force until the Lieutenant-Governor in Council should by Proclamation, to be published in the Royar Gazette, declare that the same shall come into force from and after a day in such Proclamation to be named;

AND WHEREAS an Order in Council has been passed recommending that His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor do proclaim and bring into force the said act;

NOW, THEREFORE, I do hereby under and by virtue of the said act of Assembly, and under the authority of the said Order in Council, proclaim and declare that the said act of Assembly, 2 Edward the Seventh, Chapter 5, shall go into force at midnight of SATURDAY the fourteenth day of JUNE next.

WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-Beloved Cousin the Right Honourable Sir GILBERT JOHN ELLIOT, Earl of Minto and Viscount Melgund of Melgund, County of Forfar, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, Baron Minto of Minto, County of Roxburgh, in the Peerage of Great Britain, Baronet of Nova Scotis, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, etc., etc., Governor General of Canada.
