PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the Second year
of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to
provide for the adoption of Atlantic Standard Time within the
Province," it was, amongst other things, enacted that the said
Act should not go into force until the Lieutenant-Governor in
Council should by Proclamation, to be published in the ROYAL
GAZETTE, declare that the same shall come into force from and
after a day in such Proclamation to be named;

AND WHEREAS an Order in Council has been passed recom-
mending that His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor do proclaim
and bring into force the said Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, I do hereby under and by virtue of the
said Act of Assembly, and under the authority of the said Order in
Council, proclaim and declare that the said Act of Assembly, 2
Edward the Seventh, Chapter 5, shall go into force at midnight of
SATURDAY the fourteenth day of JUNE next.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Thursday, the twenty-
sixth day of June, in the year of
Our Lord one thousand nine hundred
and two, has been fixed for our Coronation;

And whereas We are desirous that the said day should be
observed as a day of general thanksgiving and rejoicing through-
out Canada,—

Now therefore Know Ye that We have thought fit, by and with
the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint and set
apart Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of June next, as a public
holiday to be observed as a day of public thanksgiving and rejoic-
ing by all persons throughout Our Dominion of Canada.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these
presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and
to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to
be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto
affixed. WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-Beloved
Cousin the Right Honourable Sir GILBERT JOHN ELLIOT, Earl
of Minto and Viscount Melgund of Melgund, County of For-
far, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, Baron Minto of
Minto, County of Roxburgh, in the Peerage of Great Britain,
Baronet of Nova Scotia, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most
Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, etc., etc.,
Governor General of Canada.
