

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the seventh day of May, A. D. 1902, incorporating Frederic A. Jones, Merchant; Charles D. Jones, Accountant; John W. Hornbrook, Clerk; George E. Smith, Clerk; and Norman A. Hornbrook, Clerk; all of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire, and take over the furniture business carried on by Frederic A. Jones at the City of Saint John, together with all the goods, chattels, assets, property and effects owned by him in connection with said business, or so much and such part thereof, and upon such terms, as may be agreed on with the said Frederic A. Jones. And to carry on and conduct at the City of Saint John or elsewhere, the business of manufacturing, fashioning, making, buying, selling and dealing in all kinds of furniture, furnishings, supplies, and generally to deal in, buy and sell all kinds of furniture, furnishings, supplies and other materials usually dealt in in connection with a furniture and furniture manufacturing and supply business, and to act as agents for others in connection therewith, and generally to perform, conduct and carry on all business of every kind in connection with the purchase, manufacture and sale of all kinds of furniture, furnishings and supplies and all business incidental thereto, and both on commission or otherwise.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the eighth day of May, A. D. 1902, incorporating Joseph Allison, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; William H. Murray, of the same place, Lumber Merchant; George S. Cushing, of the same place, Lumber Merchant; Theophilus Cushing, of the Parish of Lancaster, in the said City and County of Saint John, Lumber Merchant; and Alexander Wilson, of the said City of Saint John, Accountant; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over, own and hold the real estate recently acquired by George S. Cushing from Charles Miller, and described in a deed thereof from said Charles Miller and wife to said George S. Cushing, dated the thirteenth day of July, A. D. 1901, and recorded in the office of the Registrar of Deeds in and for the City and County of Saint John, Libro 78 of Records, folio 218 and 219, and also the leasehold lands conveyed by said Charles Miller to said George S.
