

IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES ACT."

NOTICE is hereby given that, in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act," the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant by Letters Patent under the great seal of the Province of New Brunswick, of a charter constituting the applicants and such others as may become shareholders in the Company proposed to be created a body corporate and politic for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "Mann Axe and Tool Company, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern the axe and edge tool business heretofore carried on in the Town of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte, by Charles E. Huestis, under the firm name and style of The Maritime Edge Tool Company, together with the plant, engines and machinery, water powers, dams, pen stocks, water wheels, water ways, sluices, lands and premises, whether freehold or leasehold, or both, with the buildings and improvements thereon, now owned by or under lease to the said Charles E. Huestis, and also to purchase and acquire the good will of said business and all trade marks, patents, patent rights, trade names, distinctive marks, licenses, franchises, leases, personal property, choses in action, rights, effects, assets and liabilities of the said Charles E. Huestis, in connection with the said business.

(b) To manufacture, purchase, or otherwise acquire, hold, own, mortgage, sell, assign and transfer, invest, trade, deal in and deal with axes and tools of all kinds, and iron, steel and metal work of all kinds, and all things in connection therewith and incidental thereto.

(c) To build, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and to own, hold and possess in fee simple or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses, mills, mill privileges, machine shops, blacksmith shops, water ways, tram ways and rights, buildings, plant and machinery, dams, pen stocks, water powers, franchises and privileges and such other real and personal property as may from time to time be deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid, or any part of it.

(d) To apply for, obtain, register, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, and to hold, own, use, operate, introduce and sell, assign or otherwise dispose of any and all trade marks, patents, licenses, concessions, secret processes, formulae, trade names and distinctive marks, and all inventions, improvements, processes, machines and mechanical contrivances used in connection with or secured under Letters Patent, or otherwise, of Canada, or of any other country, and to use, exercise, develop, grant licenses in respect of, or otherwise turn to account any and all such trade marks, patents, licenses, concessions, secret processes, formulae, trade names and distinctive marks, inventions, improvements, processes, machines and mechanical contrivances or the like, or any such property, rights and information so acquired, and, with a view to the working and development of the same, to carry on any business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which the Company may deem necessary for its purposes.

(e) To purchase, acquire, lease, have and hold real and personal property of all kinds, and to mortgage, pledge and hypothecate, sell, dispose of and convey the whole or any part of the property, patents, franchises, rights and assets of the Company.

(f) To pay for any property, real or personal, and for any trade marks, patents, licenses, franchises, secret processes, formulae, trade names and distinctive marks, and for all inventions, improvements, processes, mechanical contrivances and good will which may be purchased, acquired or otherwise obtained by the company, in fully paid-up and non-assessable shares of the stock of the Company, pursuant to any agreement made or to be made to that effect.

(g) To develop, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, all kinds of power, and to use the same for the purposes of the company, and to do all things necessary or incident thereto.

(h) To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers herein mentioned, or which shall, or may at any time appear to be conducive to or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might do, and in any part of the world, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise.

3. The office or chief place of business of the proposed Company is to be established in the town of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte.

4. The capital stock of the Company is to be Forty-nine Thousand Dollars divided into four hundred and ninety shares of One hundred dollars each.

IN THE MATTER OF THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES ACT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act, and of the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Navigation Syndicate, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought and the powers of the Company shall be as follows:

(a) To build, purchase, charter, or otherwise acquire and hold ships, steam tugs, steam boats, schooners, barges, lighters and other vessels; and to sail, navigate, use, manage, control, charter and hire or make use of the same in such manner as to the Company seems expedient.

(b) To buy and sell goods and merchandise as ships' cargo and on ships' account.

(c) For the purpose of its business to build, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and hold real and personal property of all kinds, with power to sell and dispose of the same.
