NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes following:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The W. A. Fairweather Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

To acquire and take over the plant and machinery for the manufacture of vinegar, pickles and bye-products in the building situated at No. . . Smythe street, in the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, and to acquire and take over a lease of the building now held by William A. Fairweather, of the said City of Saint John, Vinegar Manufacturer.

To conduct and carry on a business, Wholesale and Retail, of vinegar and pickle manufacturers in all their branches and all businesses incidental thereto.
