

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the first day of March, A. D. 1911, incorporating Julian Charles Salmon, Accountant; William George Salmon, Merchant Tailor; Harold Gilbert Smith Adams, Accountant; May Atherton Hatheway, Stenographer, and Georgie Barnard Dodge, Stenographer, all of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of a steam and general laundry, and to wash, clean, purify, scour, bleach, wring, dry, iron, color, dye, disinfect, renovate and prepare for use all articles of wearin gapparel, household, domestic and other linen and cotton, woollen goods, clothing, fabrics of all kinds.

To buy, sell, hire, manufacture, repair, let on hire, alter, improve, trade and deal in all apparatus, machines, materials and articles of all kinds which are capable of being used for any such purposes.

To take over, acquire, hold, sell, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property, brands, trade-names, trade marks, patents of invention and copyrights.

To manufacture, produce, obtain, buy and sell and trade and deal in any and all products, goods, wares and merchandise used in or which may be used in or in connection with the business of the Company.

To acquire by original subscription, purchase or otherwise and to own, hold, sell, transfer, pledge, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of or encumber shares of capital stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations, or evidences of interest in or of indebtedness of any other incorporated Company or body corporate or corporations authorized to issue shares, stock, debentures, bonds, or any other obligations, with power while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

Generally to purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real or personal property, and to build, erect, purchase or otherwise acquire any factories, works or buildings, and to acquire as a going concern any business which the company is hereby authorized to carry on, and to assume all or any debts or liabilities in respect thereof and to acquire any property, franchises, rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for all or any of the purposes of its business, and to pay for the same or any of the same wholly or in part in fully paid-up shares and or bonds or debentures of the Company.
