

# IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT."

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the persons hereinafter named, under the said Act, to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a Grant by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick of a Charter constituting the applicants and others who may become shareholders in the Company proposed to be created a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned.

The proposed name of the Company is "The Bathurst Exhibition and Park Association, Limited."

The office or principal place of business is to be at Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester, in the Province of New Brunswick.

The amount of the Capital Stock of the proposed Company is One Thousand Dollars, to be divided into Two Hundred Shares of Five Dollars each.

## NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

APPLICATION will be made at the present Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, by the Town of Bathurst, for legislation for the purposes following:

1. To empower the Town to purchase and acquire the title to land within the Town, and to convey or lease the same for a long term of years to Chappell Brothers, to provide for them a free site for their proposed lumber mill or mills and plant, and to grant to them certain exemptions from taxation and other concessions as inducements to them to establish their proposed mill or mills and plant at the said Town.
