NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters of Incorporation, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

(b) To carry on and conduct a general engineering, contracting and construction business, iron and brass foundry and machine shop, including agricultural implements.

(c) To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in, repair, convert, alter and lease plants, engines, boilers, machinery, tools, implements, metals, bridges, rolling stock and to manufacture and fabricate iron, steel and brass.

(d) To carry on the business of electricians, mechanical engineers, machinists, fitters, millwrights, iron and brass founders, bridge builders, steel makers, and to manufacture, trade and deal in and deal with any article belonging to any such business and all apparatus, appliances and things in connection therewith or with any inventions or patents.

(e) To conduct and carry on a general hardware business, wholesale and retail, or both, and the buying and selling of mill machinery, electrical supplies and hardware of every kind and description.

(f) To establish automobile garages in the City of Fredericton and elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick.
