NOTICE OF GRANTING SUPPLEMENTARY LETTERS - PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter

Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, and amending Acts, Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Third Day of April, A. D. 1911, whereby Two Thousand Shares of the Stock of "Edward Partington Pulp & Paper Company, Limited," have been created, made and declared to be Preference Stock, and shall be issued as Preference Stock of the Company, and such Preference Stock shall have priority over the Ordinary Stock of the Company in the distribution of the assets of the Company, and shall also have preference and priority over the said Ordinary Stock as respects dividends to the extent that all the said Preference Stock shall be entitled to receive each year a dividend of five per cent. before any dividend upon the Ordinary Stock shall be payable; such right to dividends on the Preference Stock to be accumulative, and in case there is any deficiency in the payment of said dividend on the Preference Stock in any one year, such deficiency with the interest thereon at Five per cent. shall be made up and paid before any dividend shall be declared on the Ordinary Stock in any subsequent year; it being understood that no greater dividend shall be paid on the Preference Stock over and above Five per cent. ~~aforsaid~~ in any one year, and in case of the distribution of the assets of the Company for any reason whatsoever, the holders of the Preference Stock shall receive payment in full to them of the amount of Preference Stock held by them respectively at the rate of one hundred dollars per share, with any dividend paid thereon, and interest upon such unpaid dividend as above mentioned, before any amount shall be distributed to the holders of the Ordinary Stock.
