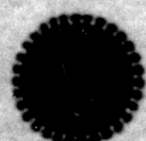

LIQUOR LICENSE ACT, 1903.

THE Liquor License Commissioners for the District of the City of Saint John, will meet in the office of the Inspector, Chubb Building, 29 Princess street, on Thursday, the 10th day of January, at 3 p. m., to consider and determine on the list of applications for license now on file, and to hear any objections that may be taken to the granting of any of the said applications.
