

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a charter of incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province, in accordance with the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and Acts in amendment thereof, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the company proposed to be created, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the uses and objects and within the powers hereinafter mentioned and set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is The Canada Construction Company, Limited.

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(d) To engage in and carry on dredging operations and railway construction, and to enter into contracts for the same, and for that purpose to acquire and obtain by purchase, lease or hire all plant, machinery, and equipment for the carrying on the same.

(e) To acquire by assignment, purchase, lease, sub-contract or otherwise, any contract, rights or privileges from any other person or persons, and to operate and complete the same.

(f) To enter into bonds or obligations as sureties, and make and execute the same for the performance of any contract, or as sureties for the performance of contracts in which the said company may be interested as contractors or sub-contractors or otherwise.

(g) To buy, purchase, acquire by lease or sell, any lands or properties that may be desirable in the interest of and for the promotion of the objects for which the company is formed, and to issue fully paid-up shares of the said Company in payment or part payment of the same, or to issue bonds or debentures of the company in payment of the same, and to sell and dispose, charge, mortgage or encumber any of the real or personal property of the company.

(h) To do all such things as are incidental to or desirable or conducive to the carrying on the business of the company and promoting its interests.

3. The head office or principal place of business of the said company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the company is to be Ten thousand dollars, divided into one hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.
