

NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter mentioned will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act."

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is to be "Reorganized Miller's Tanning Extract Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are for the purpose of purchasing, acquiring and taking over from the liquidators and a receiver as a going concern the business of the Miller's Tanning Extract Company, Limited, formerly carried on at Millerton, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick aforesaid, together with the Mills, Machinery, Buildings, Wharves, Real Estate, Lands, Premises, Property, Effects and Assets of every nature, kind and description now owned by the said Company or the Liquidators or Receiver thereof, and for the reorganization of the said business, and for the conducting and carrying on of the business of the manufacture of Tanning Extracts of all kinds from bark, wood and all other materials from which the same can be made, and all things incidental thereto.

(b) Also for the purpose of building and erecting buildings and machinery for the manufacture of pulp and paper, and carrying on the business of pulp and paper manufacturers, and all things incidental thereto.

(c) Also for the purpose of generating and manufacturing electricity for the purpose of electric light, power and heat, and selling, supplying and disposing of the same to others, and all things in connection therewith or incidental thereto.

(d) Also to acquire, have and to hold real and personal estate of all kinds, including timber licenses, mining licenses and bonds and stocks in any Company, and to take, acquire, have and hold security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever.

(e) And also to apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire and to hold, use, own and operate and to sell, assign or otherwise dispose of, and to grant Licenses in respect to, or otherwise turn to account any and all inventions, patents, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured under or by virtue of any Letters Patent of Canada, or any other country.

(f) Also to purchase, hire, construct or manufacture ships, barges, scows, tug boats, wharves, piers and docks, and to sail, rent or hire the same as may be deemed best in the interests of the Company. Also to acquire the good will, property and assets of any business or company now or hereafter carried on in the Province of New Brunswick, and to re-organize and conduct said business for such time as said company may deem expedient, or to sell and dispose of the same or any part thereof.

(g) To carry on the manufacture of lumber in all its branches, and all things incident thereto.

(h) To construct, purchase and manage any plant, building, works, factories and other undertakings for any of the purposes of the Company, or connected therewith, or incident thereto.

(i) To carry on a general mercantile business and other matters incidental thereto.

The Directors of the Company to be permitted to hold meetings of the Board outside of the Province.

3. The chief place of business of the Company shall be at Millerton, in the County of Northumberland, in said Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the said proposed Company is Ninety-eight Thousand Dollars (\$98,000).

IN THE MATTER OF THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES ACT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and of the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The North Shore Colonization Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought, and the powers of the Company shall be as follows:

(a) To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, carry on and continue all the lumbering, milling, colonizing and general business now carried on by the Reverend Wilfred Legace, in the County of Northumberland, and also the real estate and personal property in connection therewith.

(b) To carry on and operate a general lumber business in all its branches, both wholesale and retail.

(c) To carry on and operate a general fishing business in all its branches.

(d) To promote and carry on the settlement of lands and the colonization thereof by settlers.

(e) To carry on a general trading and mercantile business.

(f) For the purpose of its business to build, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and hold real and personal property of all kinds, with power to sell and dispose of the same.
