The objects and purposes of the Association are:
1. To obtain for its members such concessions and privileges from individuals and corporate bodies as it may be in such members' interests to obtain.
2. To devise and give effect to measures for the protection of the common interests of such members.
3. To assist the constituted authorities in the enforcement of the laws relating to the business of life insurance.

The Association will also apply for legislation to provide that one-half of all fines recovered for violations of the Insurance Laws shall be paid to the Association when such fines result from convictions obtained where the information of the violation has been laid by the Association, its members or agents.
