NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a Bill will be presented at the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick at the present Session thereof, for the passing of an Act for the incorporation of a Company to be known as "Fraser's Limited," for the purpose of carrying on the business of the manufacture of all kinds of pulp and paper, and products thereof, and operating a general lumbering and saw milling business in all its branches, to purchase and take over any other corporation or concern, carrying on any one or more of the said businesses, together with all property, franchises and rights now enjoyed by them, to acquire and hold lumber lands, licenses, and leases to cut lumber, boom rights, water privileges, as well as real and personal estate of all kinds, including Bonds and Stocks of any incorporated company, and generally with the object of carrying on a general pulp, paper, lumber and milling business, or either, with all usual rights and franchises incident and necessary thereto.

The amount of the Capital Stock of the proposed Company to be Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000), divided into Two Thousand Five Hundred Shares of One Hundred Dollars each, with the right on the approval of two-thirds in value of the shareholders to increase same to One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000).
