NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at its next session, for the passing of an Act to incorporate The Life Underwriters' Association of New Brunswick, with power to grant the title "Chartered Life Underwriter" ("C. L. U.") after proper examination in that behalf, and to take, purchase and hold personal property, lands, buildings and hereditaments for the purposes of the said Association, and to dispose thereof for the like purposes, no dividends being paid or allowed to its members at any time.

The objects and purposes of the Association are:

1. To obtain for its members such concessions and privileges from individuals and corporate bodies as it may be in such members' interests to obtain.
2. To devise and give effect to measures for the protection of the common interests of such members.
3. To assist the constituted authorities in the enforcement of the laws relating to the business of life insurance.

The Association will also apply for legislation to provide that one-half of all fines recovered for violations of the Insurance Laws shall be paid to the Association when such fines result from convictions obtained where the information of the violation has been laid by the Association; its members or agents.

To The New Brunswick Railway Company, and to the Central Trust Company of New York, and to all others whom it may concern.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that The International Railway Company of New Brunswick, in pursuance and under the provisions of The New Brunswick Railway Act, has paid into the office of the Registrar of this Honorable Court, the sum of three thousand dollars, being the amount of the compensation money fixed and allowed by the arbitrators under their award made in this matter, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, A. D. 1909, together with the interest thereon for the period of six months, and has delivered to the said Registrar an authentic copy of the said award for the purpose of obtaining its title to the lands described in the said award as follows, to wit: "All that certain parcel or tract of land situate in the Counties of Victoria and Madawaska in the said Province of New Brunswick, beginning at a point on the line between Crown Lands and New Brunswick Railway lands, near Grand River, about ten miles from St. Leonard's Station, running thence up the valley of the Grand River, crossing the County line between the Counties of Madawaska and Victoria near the mouth of Big Forks, so called, thence running up the valley of Mud Brook, a branch of Grand River, and crossing over the summit to the waters of Jardine Brook, thence to the County line between the Counties of Victoria and Restigouche and the adjoining Crown lands, the whole distance through the New Brunswick Railway Company's lands being 28.43 miles, and being a width of ninety feet, and containing a total acreage of 310.12 acres"—and that the said award and the title of the said The International Railway Company of New Brunswick to the said lands is under the provisions of The New Brunswick Railway Act, being chapter 91 of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, and all persons entitled to the said lands, or any part thereof, or representing as being the husbands of any parties so entitled, are hereby called upon and required to file their claims to the said compensation, or any part thereof, with the Registrar of this Honorable Court on or before the first day of April, A.
