



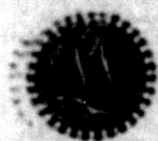

NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons who may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the objects and purposes hereinafter mentioned and set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is The Thompson Coal and Brick Company.

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To buy, lease, or otherwise acquire, hold and possess land, mining rights, plant, machinery, equipment, piers, wharves, lands, licenses and leases, water rights and privileges in connection with any coal mine or mines in the Province of New Brunswick, owned and operated as a going concern of any person or persons, body corporate, firm or incorporation, to conduct and carry on such business, with power to sell, mortgage, lease, encumber or otherwise dispose of any real or personal property so purchased or acquired by them, and for that purpose to execute all necessary conveyances.

(b) To carry on the general business of coal mining in all its branches, as such business is usually carried on in the Province of New Brunswick, and to carry on the general business of brick manufacturing in all its branches, and to establish a brick plant for the purpose of making brick and for the general purpose of said coal mining and brick making to erect and maintain all necessary buildings and machinery and to operate the same for the mining of coal and the manufacture of brick.

(c) To carry on the business of store-keeping and general trade as dealers in merchandise of all kinds, both wholesale and retail.

(d) To buy and sell real and personal property and execute all necessary conveyances therefore.

3. The office or general place of business of the said Company is to be at Sussex, in the County of King's, and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The capital stock of the Company is to be Twenty-four Thousand Dollars, divided into Two Hundred and Forty shares, of the par value of One Hundred Dollars each.
