Auditor's Report.

Fredericton, September 2nd, 1911.

Francis F. Matheson, Esq., Chairman of the Campbellton Relief Committee, Campbellton, N. B.:

Sir,—In accordance with the appointment by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, I have made an Audit of the accounts of your Finance Committee, and beg to hand you herewith a certified statement of same.

Receipts.—The total amount of cash subscriptions was \$184,233.24. The sale of cottages brought \$7,590.00. Miscellaneous receipts amounted to \$435.25. The interest credited by the banks was \$1,182.13. So that the total cash received was \$193,440.62, and the same was deposited in the banks doing business in Campbellton.

Disbursements.—The sum of \$70,000.00, contributed by the Dominion Government, was handed over to the Corporation of the Town of Campbellton, to be used solely for the purpose of paying the interest on the bonded debt of the town at the time of the fire. For general relief purposes the sum of \$114,196.77 was expended, so that the total disbursements amounted to \$184,196.77, leaving a balance of \$9,243.85 unexpended. Pursuant to the provision of 1 George V., Cap. 56, this amount (\$9,243.85) was handed to the Town of Campbellton to be used for the relief and support of the poor of the said Town.

All orders for building materials, food, and other supplies, as well as invoices corresponding with same, and recommendations for payment, have been examined by me. For all expenditure I have examined as vouchers, receipted accounts and properly endorsed cheques.

The conclusion of the arduous duties which devolved upon the Committee is no doubt a great relief, and you have as your reward at least the sense of a duty discharged to the best of your ability.
