

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under Chapter Eighty Five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903 and amending acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Eighth day of February, A. D., 1911, incorporating Arthur H. Hilyard, of Dalhousie, in the County of Restigouche, in the Province of New Brunswick, Lumberman; George A. Hilyard, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, Province aforesaid, Lumberman; Gilbert G. Murdoch, of said City of Saint John, Civil Engineer; W. Henry Harrison, of said City of Saint John, Barrister-at-Law; and Henry A. Powell, of said City of Saint John, Barrister-at-Law, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of lumberers, lumber and timber merchants and manufacturers of timber and lumber in all its branches, and all other business incidental thereto, or specially connected therewith.

To build, erect, purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire, maintain, operate, sell, or otherwise dispose of saw mills, shingle mills, lath mills, box mills and other mills for manufacturing all products of wood in the Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase, take by lease, by assignment or license and transfer of lease or license, or otherwise acquire from the Crown, or from any person or persons, company or companies, timber lands, timber limits and rights and privileges to cut timber on any lands in the Province of New Brunswick, and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same.

To lumber, cut, haul, get out, stream drive, get or transport to market or places of manufacture, all kinds of timber and trees, whether growing on or severed from the soil, and to sell, manufacture and otherwise dispose of the same.

To manufacture, buy or otherwise acquire, transport, sell or otherwise deal or trade in all kinds of sawn lumber and other goods and articles of all kinds in the manufacture of which lumber or wood is used.

To purchase, construct, take by lease or otherwise acquire, operate, charter and navigate steam or sailing vessels of every kind and nature whatsoever, and to sell, dispose of or otherwise deal in the same.

To repair, renew or rebuild steam or sailing vessels of every kind or description whatsoever.

To store, warehouse, carry and transport goods, wares and merchandise of all kinds whatsoever for hire or reward, and to carry and transport passengers by land or water for hire or reward.

To construct, take by lease or otherwise acquire, maintain and for hire or reward operate wharves, docks, dry-docks, graving-docks and repairing-docks in the Province, and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same.

For the purpose of the carrying on of said business to generate, purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire water rights, water power and electrical or other power.

For all or any of the purposes or objects aforesaid, to purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments, and rights and privileges in or connected with lands in the Province of New Brunswick.

To construct, make or manufacture, purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire and maintain, all materials, articles, engines, boilers, tackle, apparel, furniture, machines of all kinds, cranes, hoisting gear and other appliances and facilities for loading and discharging vessels, tramways, railway sidings and spurs, piers, booms, machine shops, warehouses and other buildings for the storage of goods, wares and merchandise.

To sell or otherwise dispose of the property or any of the property mentioned in the eleventh clause of the above objects.

To lease, sell, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertakings of the Company or any part thereof, and any or all of the real and personal property of the Company for such consideration, in such manner and upon such terms as the Company may deem desirable.

To do all things and every thing necessary, proper, suitable or convenient for the accomplishment or attainment of any of the purposes and objects hereinbefore enumerated or incidental to the powers hereinbefore specified, or which may at any time be necessary or expedient to be done for the protection or benefit of the Company, either as owner or interested in any property or otherwise to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, and such other things as are incident thereto; by the name of "Hilyard Lumber & Construction Company, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of Two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into Two thousand five shares of One hundred dollars each; and with the head office of the Company at the City of Saint John.
