NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants, and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes following:

1. The proposed corporate name of the company is "Atkins Bros., Limited," and the said name is not the name of any other known company, nor is it a name liable to be confounded with the name of any other known company, or otherwise objectionable on public grounds.

2. That the objects and purposes for which such incorporation is sought are:

(a) To own, operate and conduct a factory or factories for the purpose of manufacturing lumber into building materials, and to erect and repair buildings, bridges and all erections of any nature or kind, whether composed of wooden material or otherwise.

(b) To acquire, hold, sell, mortgage, lease and otherwise dispose of, pledge or convey in other lawful manner real and personal property of every kind.

(c) To contract for the erection and building of buildings of all kinds, bridges and any other undertaking, by contract, tender or otherwise, that the said proposed company may deem advisable, including the building of scows, barges and other vessels.

(d) To contract or otherwise undertake the excavation, plumbing, mason work and the electrical work, heating and glazing of any buildings or erections.

(e) To operate and conduct a lumber business.

(f) To operate and conduct a wood and coal business.

(g) To operate and conduct stream driving operations, with the right to erect and maintain booms and dams whenever same may be lawfully maintained.

(h) To buy and sell structural steel and hardware entering into any building, bridge or other work undertaken by the said company.

(i) To conduct a general store or mercantile business in connection with the said manufacturing business.

(j) To act as agents for any other dealers, businesses and corporations who may employ the said proposed company as agents, in the transaction of any business and to do such other things as are incident thereto.

3. The office or chief place of business of said company is to be at Fairville, in the County of the City and County of Saint John, in the said Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of capital stock of said company is to be twenty-four thousand dollars, divided into two hundred and forty shares of one hundred dollars each.
