

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Seventh day of June, A. D. 1911, incorporating Samuel Freeze, of Doaktown, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick, Land Surveyor; Matthew Lodge, Accountant; Arthur E. Williams, Bank Manager; Matthew C. Lodge, Manufacturer's Agent, of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, in the Province aforesaid, and Isabella A. Freeze, of Doaktown aforesaid, Married Woman, for the following purposes, namely:

To apply for, purchase, acquire, hold, use, occupy and possess licenses to search, prospecting licenses, rights to work mining licenses, mining leases, minerals, mining and other rights and interests, including mining licenses, leases and rights already issued under the General Mining Act of the Province of New Brunswick, and to carry on the business of mining and operating mines, and the acquisition, development, work, purchase and sale of mining rights, leases, areas, lands and premises, and licenses, rights and privileges in the said Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase and acquire by deed, lease, grant or otherwise, lands, water rights and water powers, and any rights and easements in respect thereto, for the purposes of the works and operations of the Company.

To carry on the business of mining and of shipping ore or minerals, and of establishing reduction or other works for the extraction of ore or minerals, and to acquire, purchase and use, hold, sell and dispose of any rights by Letters Patent, franchises and other rights, such as are necessary for the purposes of the said proposed Company.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Seventh day of June, A. D. 1911, incorporating John Abrams, Manufacturer; William Abrams, Machinist; Frederick S. Abrams, Machinist; Catherine Abrams, Married Woman; Mary G. Abrams, Spinster; Emeline J. Abrams, Spinster; and Kate R. Abrams, Spinster; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase and take over the business, assets and liabilities generally, including the good will of the business now being carried on by John Abrams Sons, at the City of Moncton, and issue in payment thereof shares of this Company, for such amounts as may be agreed upon, the said shares when so issued to be fully paid up and non-assessable.

To manufacture, buy, sell, deal in, repair, convert, alter and lease plants, engines, machinery, tools, implements, metals, boilers, locomotive, stationary and other engines, cars, trucks or other rolling stock for railway, machinery, tools and iron or steel works of all kinds, and to manufacture and fabricate steel and iron.
