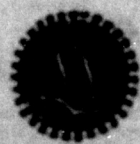

NOTICE OF ASSIGNMENT AND MEETING OF CREDITORS

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that Laula S. Smith, of the Town of Chatham, in the Province of New Brunswick, Merchant, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 141 of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, entitled "An Act respecting Assignments and Preferences by Insolvent Persons," did on the 21st day of January, A. D. 1911, make a general assignment for the benefit of her creditors to the undersigned Assignee, Henry H.
