

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is to be "The New Brunswick Construction Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To carry on the business of a general construction company and contractors.

(b) To engage in the business of constructing wharves, docks, railways, tunnels and other private and public works and undertakings, and to enter into contracts for the accomplishment of the same.

(c) To establish, construct, acquire, operate, equip, maintain and manage mills, plants, factories, machinery and appliances necessary to carry on the business of contractors and builders in all branches and to buy, purchase and acquire by lease, assignment or otherwise any lands, premises, rights, privileges and water powers necessary or desirable in the business or interests of the Company.

(d) To engage in and carry on dredging operations, and to enter into contracts for the same, and for that purpose to build, acquire and obtain by purchase, lease or hire, all boats, vessels, dredges, stone-lifters, scows, plant, machinery and equipment for the carrying on of the same.

(e) To amalgamate with any other company or companies having the same or similar objects, and to enter into all contracts and agreements necessary for such amalgamation.

(f) To enter into any agreement with any authority, whether Dominion, Provincial, Municipal or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Company's objects, or any of them, and to obtain from any such authorities any rights, privileges and concessions which the Company may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.

(g) To acquire by assignment, purchase, lease, sub-contract or otherwise, any contract, rights or privileges from any other person or persons, and to operate and complete the same.

(h) To enter into bonds or obligations as sureties, and make and execute the same for the performance of any contract, or as sureties for the performance of contracts in which the said Company may be interested as contractors or sub-contractors, or otherwise.

(i) To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above objects, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights for the time being.

(j) To pay out of the funds of the Company all expenses incidental to the incorporation and organization of the Company.

3. The Head Office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at Welsford, in the County of Queen's, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the Company is to be Forty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$49,000.00) divided into four hundred and ninety (490) shares of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) each.

5. The names, addresses and callings of each of the applicants are as follows:

#### HOUSE OF COMMONS.

##### Condensed Rules Respecting Notices for Private Bills.

1. Applications to Parliament for Private Bills shall be advertised by a notice in the Canada Gazette clearly and distinctly stating the nature and objects of the application, and signed by or on behalf of the applicants, with the address of the party signing the same. For an Act of Incorporation the name of the proposed Company shall be stated. If the works of any company are to be declared to be for the general advantage of Canada, the same shall be specifically mentioned in the notice, and a copy of such notice shall be sent by registered letter to the clerk of each county or municipality which may be specially affected by such works, and also to the secretary of the Province in which such works are or may be located; and proof of such service of notice shall be established by statutory declaration.

In addition to the notice in the Canada Gazette aforesaid, a similar notice shall be published in some leading newspaper, as follows:

1. For Acts of Incorporation—(a) Of a railway or canal company, or of a company for the construction of any special works, or for obtaining any special rights and privileges: In the principal place in each county or district affected.

(b) Of a telegraph or telephone company: In the principal place in each Province in which the company intends to operate.

(c) Of banks, insurance, trust, loan or industrial companies (without any special powers): Advertise in the Canada Gazette only.

2. For Amendments to Acts of Incorporation—(a) For the extension of a line of railway or canal, or branches thereof: In the principal place in each county affected.

(b) For the revival or continuation of a charter or for extension of time for the construction of works of any kind,

or for the enlargement of any of the powers of a company (not involving additional special powers): At the head office of the company.

(c) For the granting of any special powers or privileges: In the localities actually affected.

All such notices shall be published at least once a week for five consecutive weeks; and in Quebec and Manitoba shall be published in both English and French; and if there be no newspaper published in the locality affected, such notice shall be given in the next nearest locality wherein a newspaper is published. Proof of publication shall be established in each case by statutory declaration to be sent to the Clerk of the House.
