NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants, and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Sussex Motor Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is sought are:

(a) To purchase, acquire, and take over as a going concern, the business of Manufacturer's Agent of Margaret J. Frier, of the Town of Sussex, in the County of King's and Province of New Brunswick, and all the stock, plant, machinery, leases, rights and powers belonging or appertaining to the said business, and also to purchase and acquire the goodwill of the said business.

(b) To manufacture, buy, sell, trade and deal in Cream Separators, Threshing Machines, and all kinds of farm machinery and farm implements; gasoline engines, motor engines, electrical engines, steam engines and engines of all kinds of whatsoever motive power; machinery and electrical appliances of every nature, kind and description; motor cars, automobiles, autcycles, and electrical carriages; and all vehicles of every nature, kind and description, moved, driven or propelled by motive power of any kind whatsoever.

(c) To establish garages and repair shops for motor cars, automobiles, autcycles and other vehicles of whatsoever motive power, and to maintain and run the same, and do all things necessary or incidental thereto.

(d) To acquire and dispose of patent rights, trade marks and processes, secret or otherwise.

(e) To acquire and dispose of as going concerns or otherwise, any business, manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the business of the Company or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

(i) To purchase, acquire, hold or sell the good will of any company, firm or business, with the like objects of the company, and any lands, tenements and hereditaments, rights, plant or other assets pertaining to the same, together with the privileges, franchises, rights and powers thereof, and in connection with any such purchase or acquisition, to assume the liabilities of any company, partnership, firm or persons.

(j) To sell and dispose of the whole or any part of the property, assets, or undertaking of the Company to any other company or person.

(k) To acquire by original subscription or otherwise, and to purchase, hold, sell or otherwise dispose of the shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations of any other company carrying on or authorized to carry on any business or undertaking within the objects of the proposed company, or with like objects.
