

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Twenty-second day of November, A. D. 1911, incorporating Sherman Leonard Colpitts, of Forest Glen, in the County of Westmorland, and Province of New Brunswick, Clerk; Hazen Ashley Wheaton, of Havana, Cuba, Engineer; W. Titus Colpitts, of Forest Glen aforesaid, Millman; Nelson W. Eveleigh, of Sussex, in the County of King's and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; and J. Herbert Colpitts, of the Parish of Elgin, in the County of Albert, in the Province of New Brunswick, Farmer; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, carry on, continue and develop, to take over the assets and assume the liabilities of the milling, manufacturing, farming and general mercantile business, heretofore and now carried on and conducted by T.
