

NOTICE is hereby given that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes and objects and with the powers hereinafter mentioned and set forth:

(c) To acquire, take over and possess stock in trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses and effects and estates or rights of any person or persons or corporation or corporations now or hereafter carrying on any similar business, or to take security thereon and to continue the same when so acquired, and to sell and dispose of the same when so acquired, and any and every part thereof, or to sell and dispose, transfer and assign any of the rights of the proposed Company in and to the patents hereinbefore described.

(d) To purchase, acquire, construct or operate any and all necessary machinery for the purpose of carrying on the manufacture of the said patents, and to purchase any necessary material in connection therewith, and to sell and dispose of the product thereof.

(e) To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being carried on in connection with the above named objects or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the properties, franchises, assets and credits of the Company.

3. The head office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock in the Company is to be Twenty Thousand Dollars, divided into Two Thousand shares of Ten Dollars each.

THE SENATE OF CANADA.

Notice for Private Bills.

(Extracts from the Rules of the Senate.)

ALL Applications to Parliament for Private Bills of any nature whatsoever shall be advertised by a notice published in the Canada Gazette. Such notice shall clearly and distinctly state the nature and objects of the application, and shall be signed by or on behalf of the applicants, with the address of the party signing the same; and, when the application is for an Act of Incorporation, the name of the proposed company shall be stated in the notice.

In Cases Where Exclusive Powers are Asked.

In addition to the Notice in the Canada Gazette aforesaid, a similar notice shall also be published in some leading newspaper in the principal city, town or village in each county or district in each province or territory which may be affected by the passing of such Private Bills, according to the nature of the undertakings contemplated.

And, if the works of any company (incorporated or to be incorporated) are to be declared to be for the general advantage of Canada, such intention shall be specifically mentioned in the Notice; and the applicants shall cause a copy of such notice to be sent by registered letter to the clerk of each County Council, and of each municipal corporation which may be specially affected by the construction or operation of such works, and also, to the Secretary of the Province in which such works are, or may be located, so as to reach those officers not less than five weeks before the consideration of the petition by the Committee on Standing Orders; and statutory declaration establishing proof of such mailing must be sent to the Clerk of the Senate.

All such notices, whether inserted in the Canada Gazette or in a newspaper, shall be published at least once a week for a period of five consecutive weeks; and, when published in the Provinces of Quebec and Manitoba, shall be in both the English and French languages; and marked copies of each issue of all newspapers containing any such notice shall be sent to the Clerk of the Senate, endorsed "Private Bill Notice," or statutory declaration as to the publication may be sent in lieu thereof.
