

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Twenty-third day of February, A. D. 1911, incorporating Berton A. Puddington, of the Town of Grand Falls, in the County of Victoria, in the Province of New Brunswick, Doctor of Medicine; H. Elmer Wiley, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, in the Province aforesaid, Drug-gist; Estella M. Puddington, Married Woman; Claude J. Guy, Doctor of Medicine; and Paul C. Laporte, Doctor of Medicine, of the said Town of Grand Falls, for the following purposes, namely:

To conduct, manage and carry on a general wholesale and retail drug business within the said Province of New Brunswick for the purpose of buying, selling, dispensing and manufacturing drugs, chemicals, medicines, patent or proprietary, medical preparations, surgical instruments and supplies, and to do all things necessary or incident thereto.

To carry on a general wholesale and retail business for the purpose of buying, selling and dealing in tobaccos, cigars, pipes and fancy goods, perfumery, toilet articles, confection-ery, stationery, magazines and periodicals, books printed and blank, and such other goods as are usually kept in connection with a wholesale and retail establishment, and to do all other things necessary or incident thereto.

Subject to the provisions of the said Act, to sell, convey, mortgage or hypothecate, any or all of the property herein mentioned for the purpose of the said Company, and to do all other things necessary or incidental thereto.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, and to own and hold real and personal property, as may be deemed necessary for the above carrying on of the business of the Company, and the same to sell, mortgage, lease, pledge, encumber or otherwise dispose of or part with, including herewith power to sell, lease and encumber the business and undertaking of the company or any part thereof or any interest therein.

To acquire, purchase and possess any formulae, trade mark, trade name, trade processes and description marks in any way connected with the business of the Company.

To open agencies, employ agents, erect buildings and carry on branch stores for the manufacture of and sale of any of the products or goods of the said Company in whatever centre may be deemed advisable.

To do all things and everything necessary, proper, suitable or convenient for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the power herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient to do for the protection or benefit of the Company either as owner of or interested in any property or otherwise to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, by the name of "The Wiley Drug Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of Four thousand dollars, divided into Four hundred shares of Ten dollars each, and with the head office at the Town of Grand Falls, in the County of Victoria.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at its next Session, for the passing of an Act to incorporate The Life Underwriters' Association of New Brunswick, with power to grant the title "Chartered Life Underwriter" ("C. L. U.") after proper examination in that behalf, and to take, purchase and hold personal property, lands, buildings and hereditaments for the purposes of the said Association, and to dispose thereof for the like purposes no dividends being paid or allowed to its members at any time.

The objects and purposes of the Association are:

1. To obtain for its members such concessions and privileges from individuals and corporate bodies as it may be in such members' interests to obtain.

2. To devise and give effect to measures for the protection of the common interests of such members.

3. To assist the constituted authorities in the enforcement of the laws relating to the business of life insurance.

The Association will also apply for legislation to provide that one-half of all fines recovered for violations of the Insurance Laws shall be paid to the Association when such fines result from convictions obtained where the information of the violation has been laid by the Association, its members or agents.
