

NOTICE is hereby given, that the St. George Pulp and Paper Company, a subsisting and valid corporation, incorporated, organized and existing under and by virtue of the provisions of the Business Corporations Law of the State of New York, one of the United States of America, with its head office at Hudson Falls, New York, in the said State, will apply to His Honour, the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council, for Letters Patent, under the Great Seal incorporating the shareholders of the said Company as a Company under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act" under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

The proposed corporate name of the new Company is the St. George Pulp and Paper Company, under which name the applicant is now incorporated.

The objects for which incorporation is sought in the Province of New Brunswick are as follows:

(a) To acquire, construct, build and operate pulp and paper mills, and to engage in the manufacture and sale of pulp and paper, or any product in which pulp and paper, or any material used in the manufacture of pulp or paper, may be used, and all other business incident thereto;

(b) To carry on and operate a general lumber and lumber manufacturing business in all its branches;

(c) To carry on the business of general merchants and deal in all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise;

(d) To build, construct and erect, or acquire by lease, purchase or otherwise, and operate and maintain all electric works, shops, power houses, engine houses, and other buildings, factories, machinery, dams and appliances necessary to produce, develop, store and transmit electric, steam, hydraulic or compressed air, and all other power or force, and electricity and gas for power, lighting and heating purposes, and to supply and sell the same;

(e) To enter into any arrangement with any authorities, federal, provincial, municipal, local or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Company's objects, or any of them, and to obtain from any such authority any rights, leases, licenses, privileges and concessions which the Company may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, hold, operate under, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, leases, licenses, rights, privileges and concessions;

(f) To lease, sell, improve, manage, work, develop, exchange, hypothecate, mortgage, turn to account, or otherwise dispose of or deal with the real and personal property, franchises, rights and assets of the Company, or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company may deem fit, including shares, debentures or securities of any other Company;

(g) To construct, improve, maintain, work, manage or control any roads, bridges, ways, tramways, haulage ways and ropeways and to operate any part of the same by steam, electricity, compressed air, or other motive power, and to construct, maintain and operate telegraph and telephone and pipe lines and lines and appliances for the transmission of power, and to erect poles and other fixtures for such purposes, in connection with the objects and undertakings herein, on property owned or controlled by the company, and across and along and under any public roads, streets, highways, waterways, waters and bridges, so far as may be necessary for the business of the Company; and to collect tolls for the use or hire of the same, provided always, that no authority conferred by this clause, interfering with any municipal right, shall be exercised without the consent of the municipality affected, being first had and obtained;

(h) To erect, purchase, acquire, lease, possess in fee simple, or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses, timber limits, driving rights, options, dams, mills, buildings, mill privileges, milling business, water rights, water powers, wharves, docks, booms, piers, dams, machinery, machine shops, plant, works, boats, tugs, vessels, vehicles, timber, logs, minerals, goods, chattels, wares, merchandise and other property, real and personal, movable or immovable, and to operate such or any of the same, as may from time to time be required or deemed necessary for the accomplishment of the objects hereinabove set forth, with power from time to time to encumber the same, or any part thereof, and from time to time to dispose of any property, real or personal, at pleasure, and generally to do any and all such other things as may be incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects;

(i) To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers herein named, in which shall, or may at any time appear to be conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holders of or interested in any property or otherwise.

(j) To carry on such business in the Province of New Brunswick, and not hereinbefore specially mentioned, in so far as the same is not inconsistent with the laws of the said Province.

The head office or chief place of business of the Company in the Province of New Brunswick is to be established at the town of Saint George, in the County of Charlotte.

The capital stock of the Company is Four Hundred and Sixty Thousand Dollars, divided into four thousand six hundred shares of the value of One Hundred Dollars each.
