

PUBLIC NOTICE.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons herein-after named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, in Council, for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The New Brunswick Electric Power Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which the proposed incorporation is sought are as follows:

(1) To generate hydraulic power, electrical power, electric heat and electric light, at such places in the Counties of Saint John, Charlotte, York, King's, Queen's, and Sunbury in the Province of New Brunswick, as the Company may deem desirable, and to buy, sell and otherwise acquire and dispose of, store, transmit and otherwise deal within the said Province in and with hydraulic power, electrical power, electric heat and electric light for all commercial and other purposes.

(2) For all or any of the objects aforesaid:

(a) To purchase, lease and otherwise acquire water powers, lands, interest in lands, water rights, rights to flow lands with water and other rights, easements, privileges and franchises necessary for the efficient operations of the Company.

(b) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, erect, construct, maintain and operate canals, hydraulic raceways, dams, wing-dams, flumes, sluices, ponds, reservoirs, power and other houses and buildings, wires, cables, poles, transmission lines, machinery, works and other appliances for the generation, production, transmission, distribution and sale of electricity and pneumatic power, and to connect the said wires, cables, poles, transmission lines and other appliances with those of any other Company using electricity for any purpose, upon such terms as may be agreed upon with such company.

(c) To construct, maintain and operate such telephone lines and other conveniences between the different buildings or works of the Company, and also between the buildings or works of the Company and other buildings or works supplying the Company with light, heat, power, water or electricity as the Company may desire.

(d) To acquire by original subscription, purchase or otherwise, and to hold, sell, pledge, mortgage or otherwise dispose of shares of stock, whether common or preferred, or any bonds, debentures or other interest in or other obligations of any Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company, with full power to authorize an agent to vote in respect of any such stock so acquired.

(e) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, assume and undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person, partnership or Company carrying on any business which the Company hereby incorporated is authorized to carry on, and to amalgamate with any other Company.

(f) To sell, lease, license or otherwise dispose of the undertaking of the Company, or any part thereof, or of the real or personal property, franchises, assets, rights or credits of the Company for such consideration as the Company may see fit.

(g) Subject to such conditions and limitations as the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council may under Section 15 and Section 17 of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, impose and embody in such Letters Patent.

To enter from time to time upon any public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground or highways in any of the said counties, or in any city in the said counties, and break up and open such public streets, roads, squares or open plots of ground or highways, or any part thereof, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and posts, and stringing and maintaining thereon wires for electric light purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same, and for the placing and maintaining underground along or across such public streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways, or any part thereof, mains, pipes or conduits for the conveying of electricity, heating or lighting purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same.

(h) To do any and all things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers or otherwise, and any and all things necessary, suitable, convenient, desirable or proper for the accomplishment of the purposes or the attainment of the objects or the exercise of the objects or powers hereinbefore enumerated, or any of them, or of any purpose, object or power incidental to any of the same, or desirable for the benefit or protection of the Company, either as the holders of or interested in any property or otherwise, to the same extent and as fully to all intents and purposes as natural persons might or could do.

3. The Office and chief place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Saint John, or at such other place in the Province of New Brunswick as the directors of the Company may determine.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the Company is to be Two Hundred Thousand Dollars, divided into Two Thousand shares of One Hundred Dollars each.

5. The names in full, addresses and calling of each of the applicants are as follows:

Charles H. Easson, of the City of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Banker; Walter E. Foster, of the same place, Merchant; Percy W. Thomson, of the same place, Ship-owner; Robert S. Ewing, of the same place, Insurance Manager, and Herbert H. Beck, of the City of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario, Capitalist.

6. The aforesaid Charles H. Easson, Walter E. Foster, Percy W. Thomson and Robert S. Ewing are to be the first or Provisional Directors of the Company.
