

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the first day of May, A. D. 1912, incorporating H. Colby Smith, Merchant; Norman P. McLeod, Merchant; William E. Emerson, Merchant; Harry G. Smith, Merchant; and William R. Bennett, Master Mariner, all of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of a general dredging and construction company and contractors.

To engage in and carry on dredging operations, and to enter into contracts for the same, and for that purpose to build, acquire and obtain by purchase, lease or hire, all boats, vessels, tugs, scows, dredges, stone lifters, plants, machinery and equipment for the carrying on of the same.

To engage in the business of constructing wharves, breakwaters, docks, railways, tunnels, and other public and private works and undertakings, and to enter into contracts for the accomplishment of the same.

To establish, construct, acquire, operate, equip, maintain and manage mills, plants, factories, machinery and appliances necessary to carry on the business of contractors and builders in all branches, and to buy, purchase or acquire by lease, assignment or otherwise any lands, premises, rights, privileges and water powers necessary or desirable in the business or interest of the Company.

To acquire, hold and dispose of shares in any other Company or Companies carrying on business of a similar nature.

To amalgamate with or purchase any other company or companies having the same or similar objects, and to enter into all contracts and agreements necessary for such amalgamation or purchase.

To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof, and any or all of the real and personal property of the Company, for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms as to the Company may seem desirable.

To borrow money upon the credit of the Company, to limit or increase the same, to issue bonds, debentures or other securities of the Company, and to sell and pledge the same for such sums and at such prices as may be deemed expedient and hypothecate, mortgage or pledge real and personal property of the Company, or both, to secure any bonds, debentures or other security for any money borrowed for the purpose of the Company.

To enter into any agreement with any authority, whether Dominion, Provincial, Municipal or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Company's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such authorities any rights, privileges and concessions which the Company may think desirable, to obtain and carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges, and concessions.

To acquire by assignment, purchase, lease, sub-contract or otherwise, any contract, rights or privileges from any other person or persons, and to operate and to complete the same.

To enter into any bonds or obligations as sureties and make and execute the same for the performance of any contract, or as sureties for the performance of contracts in which the said Company may be interested as contractors or sub-contractors, or otherwise.

To acquire, purchase, use, hold, sell, transfer and dispose of any rights under patent of invention, franchises and trade marks and other rights.

To do all things and everything necessary and proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall in any way appear conducive or expedient to do for the purposes of the Company, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might do; by the name of "The Provincial Development Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and ninety shares of one hundred dollars each, and with the head office at Beauséjour, in the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John.

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the first day of May, A. D. 1912, incorporating Frederick S. Todd, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton and Province of New Brunswick, Clergyman; Harrison W. Rogers, of Northampton, in said County of Carleton, Farmer; Louis E. Young, of the Town of Woodstock, in said County of Carleton, Barrister; J. Benson Young, of Buctouche, in the County of Kent, in said Province, Clergyman; and Mary M. Young, of the Town of Woodstock aforesaid, Married Woman, for the following purposes, namely:

lumber and lumber products, and to work up and manufacture any or all of these products.

To publish and distribute literature descriptive of the Company's properties or business and take such steps to bring in immigrants and settlers to purchase its property or properties as may seem desirable, as well as open agencies, employ agents and advertise its business.

IN THE MATTER OF THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and of the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Miramichi Publishing Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought, and the powers of the Company, shall be as follows:

(a) To print and publish a newspaper or newspapers in the Town of Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, or elsewhere within the Province of New Brunswick.

(b) To purchase, acquire, maintain, operate and carry on a job printing business, book bindery, stereotyping, electrotyping and engraving plant or plants at the Town of Newcastle aforesaid, or elsewhere within the Province of New Brunswick.

(c) To purchase, acquire, maintain, operate and carry on a general publishing business at the Town of Newcastle aforesaid, or elsewhere within the Province of New Brunswick.

(d) For the purpose of its business to build, purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire and hold real and personal property of all kinds, with power to sell and dispose of the same.

(e) To acquire the good will, property, rights and assets, and assume the liabilities of any person, firm or company carrying on or transacting any business similar to that conducted by the Company, and to pay for the same in cash, or in securities of the Company, or otherwise.

(f) To acquire by original subscription, or to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares and securities in any other companies authorized to do any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or carrying out any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.
