

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1902, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the first day of May, A. D. 1912, incorporating James H. Doody, Capitalist; John O'Regan, Liquor Merchant; Henry Dolan, Liquor Dealer; all of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick; Edward D. Carter, of Erie, in the State of Pennsylvania, one of the United States of America, Banker; and William J. Emerson, of Boston, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Merchant, for the following purposes, namely:
