

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Third day of January, A. D. 1912, incorporating Philip A. Logan, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Inventor and Mechanic; Thomas Murray Brewer, of the Town of Gibson, in the County of York and Province aforesaid, Mechanic; A. Duncan Thomas, of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, Clerk; Joseph Thorburn, of Stanley, in the County of York and Province aforesaid, Farmer; and Percy A. Guthrie, of the said City of Fredericton, Barrister-at-Law, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire, take over and obtain all the right, title and interest in and to certain patents granted by the Government of the Dominion of Canada and by the Government of the United States, to one Philip A. Logan in connection with a certain invention known, or to be hereafter known and distinguished under the trade name of "The Logan Nutlock," or such other patents in any other countries as may be granted.

To purchase, acquire and obtain the conveyance of any lands, buildings, factories or shops, or to acquire the title to any lands and erect buildings thereon, for the purpose of carrying on the construction and manufacture, promotion, operation and sale of the patents hereinbefore mentioned.

To acquire, take over and possess stock in trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses and effects and estates or rights of any person or persons or corporation or corporations now or hereafter carrying on any similar business, or to take security thereon and to continue the same when so acquired, and to sell and dispose of the same when so acquired, and any and every part thereof, or to sell and dispose, transfer and assign any of the rights of the proposed Company in and to the patents hereinbefore described.

To purchase, acquire, construct or operate any and all necessary machinery for the purpose of carrying on the manufacture of the said patents, and to purchase any necessary material in connection therewith, and to sell and dispose of the product thereof.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being carried on in connection with the above named objects or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the properties, franchises, assets and credits of the Company; by the name of "The Fredericton Nutlock Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of twenty thousand dollars, divided into two thousand shares of ten dollars each, and with the head office at the City of Fredericton.
