NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province bearing date the sixth day of August, A. D. 1912, incorporating James E. Masters, of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; James D. Irving, of Buctouche, in the County of Kent, and Province aforesaid; Frank N. Hall, of Moncton, aforesaid, Railway Superintendent; Bertram E. To engage in a general ranching business for the breeding and rearing of foxes and other fur bearing animals in captivity, for market value and commercial purposes.

To buy, sell, exchange, import and export and deal in foxes and other fur-bearing animals, alive and captive, for breeding and rearing purposes, and

To make, execute and enter into contracts and agreements with any persons or companies having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this Company, for the housing, feeding, keeping, rearing or breeding of any such captive fur-bearing animals.

To carry on a trade and business in raw and manufactured furs; to buy and sell skins, pelts and hides, both manufactured and unmanufactured, and to transact any business relating thereto.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise such real estate as may be required for the business of the said Company, to sell, encumber or mortgage the same for the purposes thereof, or as may be.
