

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made by the Applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and of the several Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating and constituting the applicants, and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "R. D. Robinson Publishing Co., Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought, and the proposed powers of the Company, to be as follows:

(a) Printing, publishing, circulating, selling and otherwise dealing in daily, tri-weekly, semi-weekly weekly and monthly and semi-monthly newspapers, agricultural papers and magazines, and books and pamphlets, legal and commercial forms, and other papers and publications and general job printing, book-binding, stereotyping, photo-engraving, lithographing and generally the starting and carrying on the business of newspaper proprietors, general printers and publishers, and advertising agents, and the buying, selling, importing and dealing at wholesale and by retail, in books, paper, stationery and printers' supplies and advertising novelties.

(b) And also the purchasing or otherwise acquiring all or any part of the business, property, rights, franchises and liabilities, of any company, society, partnership or person formed for or engaged in any of the above or any similar objects or purposes, and the conducting, amalgamating with, liquidating or winding up any such business, and the establishing, promoting, becoming stockholder, shareholder or partner in, or otherwise assisting or becoming interested in or connected with any company, society, partnership or undertaking in said Province, or elsewhere, the object or purpose of which shall in whole or part be the same as or similar to any object or purpose of this Company.

(c) And also the building, erecting, purchasing, hiring, importing or otherwise acquiring or providing all buildings, offices, workshops, machinery, farm stock and implements, lands, tenements, hereditaments, and other things which such Company may desire or deem necessary, useful or expedient for or in connection with said objects or purposes, or any of them, and the selling, leasing, mortgaging, hypothecating or otherwise disposing of, borrowing or raising money upon all or any of the real and personal property, rights and franchises of the Company.

(d) And also the purchasing or otherwise acquiring any patent rights or inventions, copyrights or secret processes which may be useful for any of said objects and purposes, and to grant licenses to use the same, and the drawing, accepting, making, endorsing, discounting and negotiating bills of exchange, promissory notes and other commercial papers in the course of the Company's business, and the establishing and conducting agencies and branch offices in said Province or elsewhere, and discontinuing and regulating the same, and generally the doing, causing and procuring any and all such acts, matters and things as shall or may be incidental or conducive to the said objects and purposes, or any of them.

(e) And also to acquire the good will, property, rights and assets and assume the liabilities of any person, firm or corporation carrying on or transacting any business of a similar nature to that conducted by the proposed Company, and to pay for the same in cash, or with securities or stock of a proposed company, or otherwise as may be agreed upon.

(f) And also to acquire by original subscription, or to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares and securities in any other company or companies authorized to do any business which the Company hereby incorporated is authorized to carry on, or carrying out any business capable of being conducted so as to directly or indirectly benefit the said Company, and with this end in view to issue shares fully paid up on exchange or payment for the shares in any such Company or Companies.
