

NOTICE OF ASSIGNMENT.

TAKE NOTICE, that Howard E. Beach, of the Parish of Saint David, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick, Trader, has this day, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 141 of "The Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903," respecting Assignments and Preferences by Insolvent Persons, made a general assignment for the benefit of his creditors to the undersigned, J. William Richardson, of the Town of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte aforesaid, Barrister-at-Law, and also that a meeting of the creditors of the said Howard E. Beach will be held at my office in the Town of Saint Stephen, in said County of Charlotte, on Tuesday, the fifth day of November next, at three o'clock in the afternoon, for the appointment of inspectors and the giving of directions with reference to the disposal of the estate,

and the transaction of such other business as shall properly come before the meeting.

And further take notice, that all creditors are required to file their claims, duly proven, with the undersigned Assignee, within three months from the date hereof, unless further time be allowed by a Judge of the Supreme or County Court, and that all claims not filed within the time limited, or such further time, if any, as may be allowed by any such Judge, shall be wholly barred of any right to share in the proceeds of the estate; and that the Assignee shall be at liberty to distribute the proceeds of said estate as if any claim not filed as aforesaid did not exist, but without prejudice to the liability of the debtor therefor.
