## NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made at the next Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick to amend Chapter 53 of 10 Edward VII., intitled "An Act to incorporate the Fredericton & Grand Lake Coal & Railway Company," in the following particulars: To authorize the said Company to enter upon the Crown Lands in the Counties of York, Sunbury and Queen's in the construction of their said line of railway; to authorize the said Company to purchase and sell and deal in coal and fire clay; to issue the bonds of the Company for fifty instead of thirty years; to extend the time for commencing the construction of said line of railway; to define the terms "Mortgage Bonds," "Bonds" and "Debtentures" and to limit the extent of a first mortgage upon said line of railway, and to otherwise amend the said Act.
