D. 1912, incorporating Lewden R. Ross, Terminal Agent; Robert J. Fleming, Manufacturer; Horace C. Brown, Tailor; F. Neff Brodie, Architect; Frank E. Williams, Merchant; Kenneth J. MacRae, Barrister-at-Law; John E. Wilson, Merchant; Alexander M. Philips, Hotel Keeper; George Stephenson, Merchant, and Walter S. Jewett, Gentleman, for the following purposes, namely:

To build, erect, establish, equip, and maintain buildings, offices, halls, rooms and apartments necessary or useful for the undertakings of the Company.
