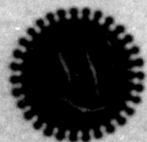

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the Twenty-fifth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in the third year of His Majesty's Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, it hath pleased Almighty God, in His Great Goodness, to vouchsafe this year unto Our Dominion of Canada a bountiful harvest and other blessings—

We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion, do call for a public and solemn acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint Monday, the twenty-eighth day of October next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favored this year; and We do invite all our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness, Our Right Trusty and Well Beloved Councillor, the Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Chief Justice of Canada and Deputy of Our Most Dear and Entirely Beloved Uncle and Most Faithful Counsellor, Field Marshal His Royal Highness Prince Arthur

William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and of Strathearn, Earl of Sussex (in the Peerage of the United Kingdom) of Great Britain and Ireland, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha; Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter; Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle; Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick; One of Our Most Honourable Privy Council; Great Master of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath; Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Exalted Order of the Star of India; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire; Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order; Our Personal Aide-de-Camp; Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.
