

**NOTICE IS GIVEN HEREBY**, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act, and several Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating and constituting the applicants, and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

(f) To erect upon such lands of the company, all houses, barns, pens and other buildings, walls, yards, fences and enclosures necessary, requisite or incidental to the purposes of such ranching business;
