

NOTICE is hereby given, that the parties hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1903, and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

1. The proposed name of the Company is "Provincial Lumber Co., Ltd."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(b) To purchase, hire, take in exchange or by way of license or lease, or by way of assignment, or as security and otherwise acquire, employ, use, own, hold, control, work and operate lands, lumber and timber limits, leases, Crown Land, lumber or timber licenses, or other lumber or timber licenses, mills, machinery, plant, wharves, booms, steamers, vessels, tugs, scows, boats, and other craft and other real and personal property and any interest therein, and any easements, franchises, rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary, suitable, desirable or convenient for the purposes of its business.

(c) To purchase, take by original subscription or otherwise acquire, and to own and hold shares in the capital stock and the bonds, debentures or other evidences of indebtedness of any other corporation or corporations, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, in Council, for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

That the proposed corporate name of the Company is "Bathurst Brick Company, Limited."

That the objects for which the proposed incorporation is sought are as follows:
